# Multiple Career Paths in the Fire Service for Veteran Medics:

EMTs and Paramedics use a lot of the skills that you may have used if you were a combat medic during deployments or even when you were stationed at home.

If you have served as a Combat Medic or Aerospace Medical Tech, then you may have obtained certification from the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians at the EMT level or higher. This can make for an easier transition; however, you will still need to be certified in your state.

If you do not have these certifications, you can complete the training at a technical or community college using your *GI Bill benefits*. The Cosumnes River College and the American River College offer programs from six months to two years long depending on your circumstances.
